A Word from Pastor Eric

October is stewardship month at APC! It will be a great time to focus on strengthening the mission and ministry of our church as we focus on the theme “Joyfully Sharing God’s Love”.

In worship, we will spend the month on the topic “The Upside-Down Kingdom”, which is about the Kingdom of God which Jesus proclaimed and which was central to his life and ministry. If we want to follow Jesus, this is important stuff! Each Sunday will also feature a Minute for Mission at which different congregation members will address our stewardship theme. We share God’s love through our giving and our living, and this will be a chance to focus on both. The dedication date for financial pledges is October 27.

On October 6, we will not only recognize World Communion Sunday, but also receive the Peace and Global Witness Offering, which is one of the four denominational offerings of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and is used both locally and throughout the world to work for peace in situations of conflict. APC is one of only a few churches in our Presbytery that take part in all four denominational offerings, which highlights the importance of mission to our congregation.

Throughout the month, our adult discipleship ministries will continue with numerous Bible study opportunities. The Sunday school class I am leading called, “Pro-Future Faith” will extend through the end of the month. On Tuesday, October 15, at 6 pm, our AMOS team will be sponsoring a showing of the movie “God and Country”, which explores the topic of Christian nationalism, and its subversion of authentic Christian faith. A discussion will follow, led by Connie Ryan from the Interfaith Alliance of Iowa.

October will also highlight our outreach efforts. On Wednesday, October 30, we will once again hold our community-wide Trunk or Treat event, which is always an enormous success in serving our neighbors. Finally, as we make our way through October, you will be hearing about plans for November 3 to be an Invitation Sunday. You will be encouraged to consider people you might invite to worship that day, and provided tools to help you do so. Our Outreach Committee hopes this will be the first in an ongoing series of invitation events designed to help our congregation share the good news of God’s love with ever more people.

I hope you will join us for worship, discipleship, mission, outreach, and fellowship this month as we rededicate ourselves the work of God’s kingdom.

OUR COROZAL, EL SALVADOR PARTNERSHIP

Have you ever felt unimportant or even invisible; powerless or even hopeless? I know I have. God's intention is for each of us to know our worth, which is immeasurable to God. Luke 12:7 tells us: *Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.* When you sit with that thought for a few minutes, it is incredibly hopeful and powerful.

Our partnership with Corozal, El Salvador has a purpose far beyond trying to solve their problems caused by decades of poverty, violence and war, and a government that invests too little into the basic needs of its populace. When we visit, face-to-face, with the Corozal leadership they tell us the most important gift we bring to them is not the food baskets or medicines, although they are grateful for the needed items. The most important gift we bring is ourselves and our friendship.

What does that mean? First of all, it is very humbling to know how much our presence means to them, and they are very sincere. They are delighted to see both new faces and old friends when a delegation comes. They tell us they pray FOR US! Again humbling. Our presence, on behalf of the APC congregation, brings them a sense of visibility, of value, of knowing that a group of friends in another country finds them of worth. Our friendship

builds on that sense of worth. We are important to them, and they are important to us. Our 20+ years of partnership has also brought a powerful sense of trust between us.

The families of Corozal have many problems that we can't begin to solve. But perhaps our partnership is not intended to "solve their problems." They have just as many smart people in their community as we do. They do lack the financial resources and civic supports that we take for granted in Ankeny, Iowa. Perhaps we are already fulfilling our purpose as partners with Corozal, without the problem-solving. We have broadened our understanding of life in El Salvador. We see God working in the lives of our partner families and how they give thanks to God for all their blessings. We can see God's spirit in them and through them. Again humbling. We bring them our friendship and the knowledge that we find them valuable. We truly are sisters and brothers in Christ.

In the months ahead, we will partner with Corozal on another project to benefit their community. This will be a project of their choosing and updates will be shared as that progresses. This partnership would not be possible without both your spiritual and financial support. Please pray for our partners as they pray for you. May this partnership be a blessing for us all.

This year marks the 40th anniversary of the PCUSA Peacemaking Offering. APC will collect this Special Offering on **October 6th**, World Communion Sunday.

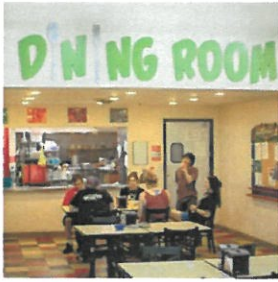
50% of this Offering supports the work for peace and reconciliation being done by Presbyterians across the globe. 25% of the Offering will be used by our Presbytery and Synod for peacemaking efforts in their regions. The remaining 25% will be used by APC to support local peacemaking efforts. The Mission Committee has chosen to designate this portion of the Offering to the local International Rescue Committee (IRC).

The IRC provides emergency relief, protection, rehabilitation assistance, resettlement services and advocacy for refugees, and victims of oppression or violent conflict. Their mission is to help people whose lives and livelihoods have been shattered by conflict or disaster to survive, recover and gain control of their future.

Through participation in the Peace & Global Witness Offering, our church is extending Christ's peace throughout our community and our world. Peace begins with each of us.

Thank you! to everyone who contributed to the meal that was delivered to the Youth Center in September! We get notes of appreciation every month for the meals that we provide.

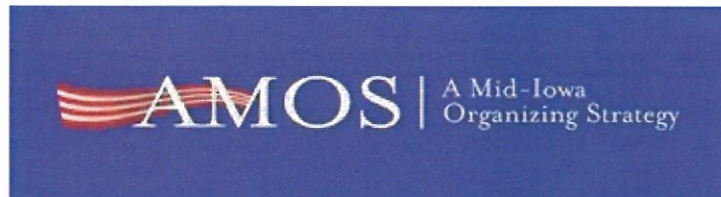

AMOS is a broad-based organization of faith congregations, neighborhood groups, and nonprofits working together to develop citizen leaders, strengthen community institutions, and advocate on the issues important to families. Together, AMOS leaders are working to build relationships across lines of race, income, citizenship status, geography, and religion in Des Moines and surrounding suburbs, Ames, and rural Polk, Story, and Warren counties and Perry. APC is a member of this organization.



What is AMOS up to in Ankeny?

In addition to participating in the broad organization, a subgroup of Ankeny based AMOS participants meet quarterly to discuss issues specifically affecting our members and the greater Ankeny community. Here are some updates on the issues that we are currently addressing.

ACSD

A key focus for the Ankeny AMOS group is supporting the Ankeny Community School District. They've met with members of the school board, the superintendent, representatives of the Ankeny police department, teachers, and students. Discipline and effective communications are key concerns. The group has also met with the Des Moines Public School officials and leaders of the Let's Talk Now program.

Let's Talk Now is a stand-alone nonprofit entity and AMOS's newest member institution. In 2013, Let's Talk emerged out of an AMOS organizing process to disrupt the school to prison pipeline and decrease the disproportionate number of students of color suspended and referred to the juvenile justice system. Today, Let's Talk mediators are embedded in more than 10 Des Moines Public Elementary and Middle Schools.

Housing

Work continues on affordable housing through the Community Land Trust (CLT) initiative. Initially focused primarily in the Des Moines area, this initiative has expanded to include all of Polk County and AMOS participants. CLT leaders have been presenting to various groups in the communities, educating on the initiative and looking for community participants that are interested in this work. A presentation is scheduled with the Noon Ankeny Rotary group in October.

Transportation

The DART team is in a research phase building their constituency of DART riders and supporters to reimagine the central Iowa transportation system. Funding continues to be a critical concern for this initiative.

Upcoming Events

- **"Building Bridges & Organizing Communities"** Seminar in Perry on October 5, 2024, 9:00 am – 4:00 pm. This is an ecumenical seminar scheduled to explore issues faced by both urban and rural communities in Iowa. The program will include a presentation by the ISU Shrink Smart research team. Leaders from many denominations will be participating in this event, including The Presbytery of Des Moines' Amgad Beblawi and Ian McMullen. Lunch will be catered by The Hotel Pattee. The event is free. Participants must register (for lunch count) at www.amosiowa.org/bridges-seminar.
- **The Annual AMOS Variety Show** will be held on Saturday, November 9, 2024 at 7pm at the Ames United Church of Christ. A silent auction and refreshments will be part of the evening. Tickets are available online at www.amosiowa.org/varietyshow. Last year's event was a huge success. AMOS is currently looking for acts to fill the evening's program.

provided. Following the meal, a variety of acts will be presented in the sanctuary for your entertainment!

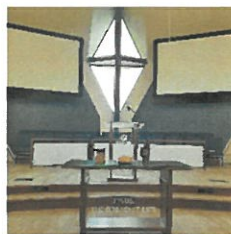
